

Summer School at Bryan

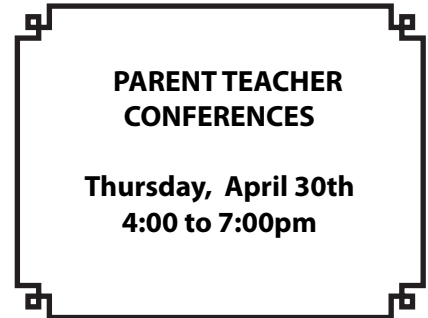
Summer school will be held at Bryan again this summer. Classes will be offered through the online E-Learning program. If students are interested in registering, they can get an application in the office. Registration will be held April 20th to May 29th. If a student qualifies for free or reduced lunch, then tuition for summer school will be free. However, you must have the appropriate paperwork completed

for Free and Reduced lunches. See the office for questions.

Graduation Information

General:

1. Diplomas will be issued only after student has completed ALL graduation requirements including volunteer hours for GoPo.
2. Students attending summer school will sign a graduation contract. They will be allowed to walk at graduation with their graduating class. They may pick up an '09 diploma at their home high school at the end of successfully completing summer school.

Bryan Graduation Ceremony:

1. A Recognition Ceremony for graduates will be held on Thursday, June 4 at 7:00 PM at Lux Middle School.
2. Students going through the Recognition Ceremony will be required to wear a cap and gown which will be provided free of charge. Caps and gowns will be issued on Wednesday, June 3rd, during school and will be turned in following the ceremony. Students will be allowed to keep the graduation tassel. Those wishing to purchase a cap and additional tassel may do so for \$8.50. Additional tassels alone will cost \$3.50. Orders and payment must be turned in by Tuesday, May 26. Order forms are available through the Bryan office.
3. Official diplomas issued from students' home schools will be handed out at the Bryan Recognition Ceremony when the cap and gown are turned in. If a student chooses to walk at the graduation ceremony at his/her home high school, the diploma will be handed out there.
4. Students who will not attend any ceremony may pick up their official diploma from the Bryan Office any time after June 8.

Home High School Graduation Ceremony:

1. Students choosing to walk at their home high school ceremony will receive information from that school. Those students' diplomas may be picked up at the end of the ceremony, unless summer school courses are required.
